**Sept 3 (2015) Karen Combs** A native of Michigan, Karen Combs began quilting in 1973. She has a degree in library science and has worked at many state, city and school libraries before finding her calling as a professional quilting instructor, writer and designer. Her quilts are known for taking a traditional pattern and giving it her own unique "twist." Karen is intrigued with quilts of illusions and has been designing quilts with a 3-D look for several years.

Karen is the author of five books, and her work has been published in several magazines as well as exhibited nationwide. Nominated for Teacher of the year three times by Professional Quilter Journal, Karen travels nationwide to teach her techniques and methods. She will lecture on Quilts of Illusion, and teach us how to make our own in two workshops.

**Sept 4** Friday we will cut and paste to learn how to create transparency in our quilts.

**Sept 5** Saturday we will make our own Patchwork Illusion, under Karen's helpful eye.

# Library News

We hope you all had a wonderful summer reading the quilting books you borrowed. They are due at the Sept. 3rd meeting. Please contact us (library@illinoisquiltersinc.org) if you won't be able to attend. The following information found on the internet is a sample of the trivia you can find in our history books (Gray section – History/Geography). Maybe this will help you sell tickets for our raffle quilt!

### **Indigo and White**

In the late 1890's the trend was for blue and white quilts, particularly indigo blue and white. There was scarcely a quilter to be found who did not have at least one in her collection. This accounts for the fact that so many of these spectacular quilts survive. Many incorporated appliqué but the overwhelming majority were pieced. Trapunto and elaborate feather quilting was often used. Blue and white were the colors of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, a very powerful, popular group. As many surviving blue and white quilts are in the Drunkard's Path pattern there is speculation that many were made for "The Cause". It is far more likely that this was simply a very popular combination due to it's striking beauty. Another reason? Indigo was a superior dye, the color true and fast. Demand for indigo dyed fabrics was high and companies printed large quantities of them. Blue and white remains popular to this day but never as much as at the end of the 19th century.

### **Indigo Blue**

Indigo dye was used in quiltmaking from the eighteenth century onward. In the period before 1830, indigo blue dye was very dark, often appearing black or violet, especially in digital images. Wool and flax were often dyed with this blue and used as a solid in wholecloth quilts and calamanco. Throughout the rest of the 19th century indigo blue was often seen as background in prints, sometimes with the overlaying print in chrome yellow or orange. Indigo continued to be common in cotton fabrics through the Edwardian period. Today, indigo blue dyes similar to those made in earlier centuries are still common in African quiltmaking and sometimes used in contemporary American art quilts.

### **Lancaster Blue**

Lancaster blue, sometimes called Pennsylvania blue after Pennsylvania's Lancaster County, are a 'double blue' similar to double pinks in that they are composed of a fine light blue print on a slightly darker blue ground. They were popular in quiltmaking in the same period as the double pinks, roughly 1860 to 1880.

### **Cadet Blue**

Cadet blue is a light blue that was first used around 1880 and was most popular in the period from about 1880 to 1910. It is often paired with white in prints.

### **Prussian Blue or Lafayette Blue**

Prussian blue was very popular in America in the 1850s, and was first used in the US in the early 1830s. Prussian blue was commonly used in ombre prints, prints which featured a gradation from light to dark. From: http://www.quiltindex.org/~quilti/wiki/index.php/Fabric\_Dating\_References




