2020-2021 PROGRAM UPDATES (via Zoom)

AUG 6, 2020 – ZOOM Lecture: **Latifah Saafir** “How Many Ways to Sew a Curve?” Lecture begins at 7:00. PLUS A BONUS! 15 minute demonstration on “Pin-less Curved Piecing”, a discount on Latifah’s products on her website: www.latifahsaafirstudios.com and one lucky member will win a free give-away! Latifah is a Modern quilter, recently featured in QuiltFolk Magazine, Issue 11. Her “Stairway to Heaven” quilt adorns the cover.

Known for her bold and innovative modern quilts, and combining her training as an engineer with her lifelong passion for sewing, Latifah creates designs that are graphic and contemporary, featuring challenging techniques with meticulous attention to detail. A co-founder of both the Los Angeles Modern Quilt Guild and the worldwide Modern Quilt Guild, Latifah currently teaches workshops to guilds around the country. SEP 3, 2020 Sarah Evans-Lecture on “Rita’s USA Embroidery Quilt”.(Lecture begins at 7:00 pm) In September 2019 Sarah volunteered to long arm quilt an unfinished estate sale find. By November the project had garnered national media attention and required extra work on Sarah’s part. Before quilting it, she coordinated the preparation of the blocks (embroidered by 100 different artists) and supervised the hand piecing of the top by 35 additional volunteers. She will talk about the process of creating Rita’s Quilt, from inspiration to completion, and share pictures.

Regular guild announcements will follow the lecture. Have your Show & Tells ready to share!

OCT 1, 2020 Pat Burke from Shannon Fabric Company. (Lecture begins at 7:00)

Spend an evening with Pat Burke, an educator for Shannon Fabrics, will share a trunk show of quilts made from various types of plush fabrics available on the market today, including Cuddle, Minky, Luxe Plush, Faux Fur and more.

OCT 3, 2020 - Workshop: Infinity Scarf & Cuddle Pillow Case - Virtual ½ Day Class – Workshop Fee: \$25 This is a great introductory class for beginners, so consider doing it with a child/grandchildren. Both items make great gifts for the Holidays. No additional workshop fee for kids.

How to SHOW your Show and Tell

While we are Zooming, Show and Tell takes a bit of preparation. If you are on a "regular" computer, have a picture of your quilt OPEN on the desktop before you join the Zoom call. Then, when we ask people to Share, you'll be able to click on "Share," and a screen will pop up that includes your already-open photo. You then click Share a second time, and the rest of us get to see your piece! If you are using your phone for Zoom, when you hit share, it will ask you to access photos, and as long as you have a pic of your quilt in your photo gallery, you can click on it and show.
