I have been in contact with an organization called Sarah's Circle. This agency provides many services to homeless and recently rehoused women. www.sarahs-circle.org. The website has lots of information about the organization. While talking with the staff, I learned that they will be opening a brand new apartment building to house 38 women.*

This link tells more about the apartments and the women housed there. The building is on Sheridan Road and will open in November \ December. The staff told me it would be lovely if each woman was welcomed to their new apartment with a lap quilt. The quilts can be tied and don't have to be quilted. We need 38 quilts by mid-December."*

So, can we get together (in heart and spirit) and support this cause? Diana and I have both committed to a quilt, and hopefully there are others willing to join us. Lap quilts are approximately 45" x 60", and while the email says that the quilts can be tied, a simple stitch in the ditch or meander would be just as easy.

MEMBER PROFILE

Meet Staci Raymond! IQI member since 2019

Staci, a creative kid who loved art and fashion, had a sewing section during middle school in Home Ec and was hooked. She begged for a sewing machine, but her parents thought she would 'use it once' and then it would collect dust, so they said no. (HA!) Later, she went to IU (Indiana) and majored in Apparel Merchandising with a minor in fine art. Her senior year, she took a sewing construction class. She was certain, this time, she wanted a sewing machine. In 1991 she received her Singer as a graduation gift. She went on to get a 2nd degree in Fiber Arts from The Art Institute of Chicago.

"Textiles were the perfect blend of fashion and art for me. Quilting was a way to hold on to favorite clothes, fun costumes, special items - all held in a patchwork of memories to hang on the wall and keep forever."

Staci's career stops have included The Columbus College of Art & Design, Brooks Brothers, Victoria's Secret Catalog, and Holly Hunt. She's made many quilts over the years, but after having 2 daughters (now 7 and 9) she had put it on the back burner.

When Covid-19 hit in March and there was talk of a shutdown, she was terrified. Her parents and in-laws are older and have pre-existing conditions. She immediately started researching mask making. She initially thought that her brother's screenprinting and embroidery business (where she works part-time) could do something to help with mask production, but they were shut down, deemed nonessential. But she started making masks... obsessively making masks -- like it was her job. Every spare minute and every night after putting the girls to bed, she would put on music and sew late into the night.

"As every guild member knows, we are makers. There is a certain relaxation and energy we receive from using our hands to make something. This was my way of being productive and helpful during an unbelievable and uncertain time."

She made masks initially for her extended family. She was approached to make masks to sell, but instead gave them away with a suggested donation to one of her favorite charities, the Children's Tumor Foundation. She's made and donated masks to Masks Now Illinois, for neighbors, friends, and strangers in her community. She's donated to grocery store workers, USPS workers, her brother's employees, her children's teachers, and (thank you!) IQI efforts. Throughout, she was STILL sewing them all on the only sewing machine she's ever owned - that \$100 Singer from 1991. When it stopped working, a kind woman on Facebook offered to loan Staci hers - she used it for nearly 6 months until she could get a basic Singer sewing machine to replace her old one. Fabric purchased, and then donated from IQI re-energized her to make yet more. TO DATE, Staci has made almost 900 masks, and picked up another round of fabric recently with the plan to celebrate 1,000! SEW ON, STACI!!
