MEMBER PROFILE

Meet Linda Howard! IQI member since Forever

I am a “senior” member of IQI and have been the Oakleaf editor since around 2013. To put this into perspective, I’ve put together approximately 96 issues of the newsletter. Yikes!!

Nels and I raised our two grown sons (now 45 and 47) in Wilmette and I remember our firstborn was around 2 years old when I made my first quilt, a hideous Grandmother’s Flower Garden with an orange background. Don’t know where it is now, sadly, because it would show how far I’ve evolved.

It was in the ‘70s when I took quilting lessons from a lady who owned a fabric store on the northwest side of Chicago. This was long before quilt shops existed. The store sold a lot of sheer curtain and upholstery-fabric, and, of course, calico. The woman taught me the basic blocks— 9-patch, drunkard’s path, applique, cathedral windows. She must have been a good teacher, because I was hooked.

At that time I was an ad agency art director, so I had little time for a hobby. But I think my graphic background in design and the love of textiles kept me interested.

Fast forward to early 2000’s. The kids were grown and I was free-lancing with my husband, a copy-writer, so I decided to take a part-time job doing something I loved...Quilting!

Cotton Pickers on Dempster hired me in August and Lu Olsen (the owner) promptly retired 3 months later. But I got a taste of dealing with the public and discovered that I was pretty good at putting fabrics together and helping underconfident and overconfident quilters. I also enjoyed getting a discount—thus the reason for my humungous stash.

In 2003, my employment began at **Quilter’s Palette** and I was there until Sharron Evans closed

the store in 2006. More stash. Was I responsible for all those quilt store closings??

In 2008 I began working at **Quilter’s Heaven** and continue to this day. I enjoy the customers, and over the years, have had amazing co-workers. And of course, enjoyed that discount. More stash.

Over the years, I have been privileged to travel to nearby states and quilt shows with some extraordinary women, staying in homes and hotels, stitching in the evening and seeking out quilt shops in the daytime. Those are the times when friendships are forged and not forgotten.

Speaking of friendships, my Wednesdays at Morning Glories (a group that meets weekly) have brought me such joy. Such support. All because of quilting.

This year we will all miss the annual Quilt-In, which I only missed once since it began. I look forward to the day when we all can meet face to face again, maskless.


