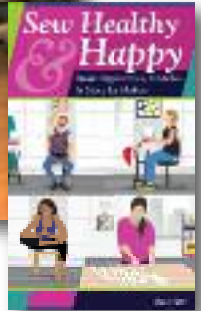
JULY 8th via ZOOM

SEPTEMBER 11th LIVE Workshop in Evanston

Maggie Weiss “Exploring Shibori Style Fabric Dyeing”

Using age-old methods, students will fold, clamp, stitch and crunch their fabric with modern materials as they learn Japanese Shibori resist techniques for indigo dyeing. We'll focus on dyeing up to 12 fat quarters in 100% cotton, silk or linen, some of which students may want to prepare ahead of time. A short pre-class demo meeting to help familiarize students with some stitching and wrapping techniques ahead of time will be set up on Zoom.

MEMBER PROFILE

Meet Chris Deering!

Hi, I'm Chris Deering. I've been a serious quilter since 2000, but of course, it goes further back than that.

My very first quilt was a painted and hand quilted table mat made to teach my Girl Scouts that skill as part of their badge requirements. But I'd been crafty as far back as I remember. I've always had some sort of craft going – crochet, knitting (I taught my self to knit continental style), counted cross-stitch, embroidery, clothes sewing, and so on. I'm sure you all know what I'm talking about!

Before I found "real" quilt friends I was involved in on-line groups, with fabric and block swaps. I was so pleased when my daughter made some quilts! It's fun to share interests with her.

Formal education started with a Sampler class at Cotton Pickers around 1997. We were only supposed to make 4 blocks with 4 techniques, but I fell in love with the other blocks in the book. I had over-purchased fabric for an on-line swap so decided to use that. I ended up with a queen-sized quilt, entirely done by hand!

In the years since I seem to have decided that I love doing precision work – scrappy, and the more pieces the better! Crazy, huh? I still love hand work – EPP, needleturn applique, and quilting by hand. I have way too many quilts and am making mostly for charity now. I've helped design and execute banners for a local church, a Dresden-type tie quilt for the pastor to gift to her husband, and numerous raffle quilts.

I'll brag a little bit here; I have received several ribbons from local quilt shows and I was especially honored to receive the Award of Merit from The National Association of Certified Quilt Judges.

I'm a single mom with 2 kids and 3 adorable grandsons. I was a physical therapist for 35 years and retired 5 years ago. I'm a member of 3 real-life guilds, a weekly "bee" and 2 on-line quilt groups.
