


# IQI's 2022 Quilt-In will be January 28-30.

Register now with a deposit of \$165 to join the fun. Non-members can register now as well so encourage your friends to join us. We need at least 20 registrations by Nov. 15 to keep our reservation with the hotel. A \$15 surcharge will be added to the fees after Nov. 15. Final payments will be due December 15. Register soon to join the fun. We only have room for 30.

We will be at the hotel at 2875 N. Milwaukee, Northbrook, IL, just west of 294, just south of Willow/Palantine Road. We begin Friday afternoon and then forget the rest of the world until Sunday afternoon. Your registration will include three meals on Saturday and Sunday brunch. The restaurant in the hotel will be open Friday evening or you can go out with friends.



Easily move in your supplies to the first floor sewing room located adjacent to an entrance on the south side of the building. Elevators go to our assigned sleeping rooms. There will be a couple of short classes offered but the focus will be your own projects. Each person has a 6 foot table. The ironing and cutting stations are shared. Our sewing area is large and away from the rest of the hotel. If you like, sew all night!

Join us! The fee is \$365 if you choose single occupancy and only \$265 to share in a room with two double beds. Toddler size would be 3x5.*

*I have 3 ready for pin basting, quilting and binding if anyone wants to come by my house and get them for finishing. We are all working on our own these days and I will keep getting more ready but I do need help.*

## Challenge Quilt 2021-22 Cover Tunes

Sing a song in thread! This year's challenge asks you to interpret a song in fabric, any song or piece of music: Beethoven's 5th Symphony or Rock Around the Clock—anything goes. You can use the title of a song as inspiration, or part of the lyric, i.e., "10,000 holes in Blackburn, Lancashire," or "cellophane flowers in yellow and green."

Use any method—piece, applique, trapunto—to create and embellish it.

All quilts must be 14" square—just like a vinyl album cover.

All must be constructed with 3 layers of fabric with a bound or finished edge.

The \$5 entry fee is due December 31, and rises to \$10 January 1. Last minute inspiration will cost you \$15 from April 1– May 15.

The song title inspired by your quilt will be displayed along with the quilt and the quilt title. Please share this info with Diane by May 15th. Finished quilts are due June 2 at the annual potluck meeting.

## Meet Georgia Cibul!

I began my descent into Fabric Acquisition in the late 1970's. I decided to make quilts for my daughters beds. Thus it began.

I joined IQI in 1983 and was on committees and on the Board in a "blink". When Mary Ray (remember Mary?) was president and I was program chairman, we instituted the Quilt-In at Techny. And it continues to today. After I became president, the following year I worked the Education Table at FAOF and continued to "man" the table until this year.

But I digress. The person who I blame for my fabric buying was Lou Olson, owner of Cotton Pickers Fabric store, where I worked for 6 years. She is mainly responsible for my fabric stash!

It was there that I took a class from Diane Capitani at the store and quickly became an addict. I love hand and machine piecing as well as applique, but I have never learned to actually quilt.

Over the years I have made about 150+ quilts, some still laying on a bed, but most live with my children and grandchildren, close friends and relatives.

Needless to say, each quilt required me to buy more fabric. Thank goodness I have one granddaughter who wants it all!

I made a very special quilt for my sister-in-law, an avid Michael Buble' fan. (see below). I got so tired of hearing how he was better than Harry Connick Jr., so I made this quilt to shut her up!—by the way, it didn't work.



I also made many Halloween quilts because it was my late husband's birthday. When he was a boy, his mother convinced him that the holiday was actually in honor of him.
