December 2 ZOOM Meeting at 7 pm

Pam Holland “Life Journals in Textiles”

For 25 years, Pam traveled the world teaching quilting and textile art. She will share her recent 10 year focus on studying textiles in their purest form, from cotton fields in India to the remote villages of Guatemala, Thailand, Morocco, Mexico and Africa. Her study of weaving, dying and printing led to a mud hut in the desert of India with women creating textile masterpieces sold to feed their families. Enjoy an evening of visual exploration!

Jeff Mishur “Faith Ringgold’s Story Quilts and Paintings”


She will discuss color theory and how to create a color palette following 4 simple steps.



Challenge Quilt Inspiration #1

To help get your creative mind going, I plan to offer a monthly inspiration.

The November Block of the Month brought to mind the Malvina/Pete Seeger song, "Little Boxes" which was about cookie cutter houses on a hillside in California. It's an interpretation of the song, all by itself, but you could take it even further.

You could make the block, and use green, blue, pink and yellow like in the song.

Or make four blocks together for 16 little houses. Or use the house pattern and make it in decreasing sizes to show receding distance, and arrange them on the hillside. Or add doctors, lawyers and businessmen coming and going from their little boxes.

The next time you look through a book of blocks, see if any of them inspire you
Challenge Quilt Guidelines:

Interpret a song with any method, any fabric
Finished size 14" square, 3 layers of fabric with a bound edge

Entry fee of \$5 is due by December 31—next month it rises to \$10!

Meet Ruth Stegmeyer!

My passion for sewing was realized many years ago, making clothing for dolls as a child. In doing this I developed a wide variety of related skills. My goal was always to create something beautiful, and whether sewing, weaving, stitching, knitting, tatting or crocheting, creating patterns that were eye-catching was always the goal.

Creation of doll clothes rapidly transitioned to working with fabric.

My fascination specifically with quilting started in the late 60s. I was self-taught to a degree until the mid-80s when I began to attend classes. After I retired, I continued participating in workshops. I have learned many different approaches to quilting, some old and some new.

Since 1996 I have been showing a number of my quilts at the "Fiber Arts Show" at the Botanic Garden.

I have been a member of Illinois Quilters, Inc. for about 30 years.

Today the majority of my quilts are machine pieced and quilted. I do both hand and machine applique. Paper piecing is challenging; however the end results are always beautiful.

Places besides the Fine Art of Fiber I have exhibited my quilts are Hoffman Estates, the Quilt Connection in Chicago, the Irish American Heritage Center and a challenge quilt at the Minnesota Quilters in Rochester, Minnesota.
