

Monthly Meeting Thursday, April 13

Connie Martin finds joy in telling about the secret codes and hidden messages used over 200 years ago by abolitionists and fugitive slaves to signify escape routes to the North, and in the family quilts of her ancestors. Connie is a sixth-generation descendant of captured African slaves forced into slavery in America. In her lecture, "Pre-Civil War Quilts: Secret Codes to Freedom on the Underground Railroad," she will tell the history of the Underground Railroad and the safe routes as well as the stories of the meaning and interpretations of the quilt codes that have been passed down to her. She will show how quilts were used to signal plans, warn of dangers, indicate how transport might occur, or who might help as "Friends" on the Underground Railroad.



If you haven't been attending meetings in person lately, April would be a great month to start again. The speaker has some wonderful artifacts to share, which always have greater impact in person than online. The weather usually isn't so bad, you can check out the library and upcoming events and get entered in the monthly attendance raffle, and get a great look at Show and Tell.

Library News


The Library has a variety of books on the topic of our April lecture and workshop. See what we have about the Civil War and machine quilting that you can check out. Examples below.

In this class, you will learn creative ways to use your walking foot for quilting and extend your knowledge of those skills and patterns as the day progresses.

We will discuss color choices and using simple design principles to create an original dynamic composition.
