


# May 7 Workshop: "Scrap Stratification" 9 am-3 pm Gloria Dei 133 Pfingsten Rd., Northbrook

scheme. Then, using your color-theory-informed scrap collection, start constructing the treasure box block, a quilt block so versatile that you can't help but revisit it again and again!! Take home the start of a new quilt or table runner!

This stunning quilt measures 103" wide by 81" high, as displayed. The leaves are upcycled silk ties, giving the quilt a very interesting dimension not seen with cotton. The dark background is black and navy blue and has a faced binding. The custom quilting was donated by Sue DiVarco who quilted veins in the leaves!

IQI's 2022 Fall Retreat will be September 9–11, at Crowne Plaza, 2875 N. Milwaukee Ave, Northbrook, IL. Mark it on your calendar now and send in your registration form and deposit.

If you haven't tried a quilters' retreat before, let this be your first. Join others for a weekend devoted to fabric and the art of quilting. Spend your time sewing and chatting without food planning or preparation. The hotel will provide a light dinner Friday night, three meals Saturday and a buffet brunch on Sunday morning. Go to bed early or stay up sewing all night. Each of us will have a 6-foot table to leave set

up throughout the weekend. There are cutting stations and ironing stations to share. Start a new project, focus on a UFO which has been calling to you, or finish that piece for the Fine Art of Fiber.

Two mini-workshops will be offered: Paper Piecing a Celebration table runner and Strip Piecing Bargello. Registration fees are \$275 (double occupancy, shared room) and \$375 (single occupancy).

# MEMBER PROFILE

### **Meet Jan Aaron!**

There seem to be few aspects of the quilting world that Jan Sneesby Aaron hasn't explored over the last forty years. Not a surprise since Jan began developing sewing skills at age four with her grandmother and started sewing clothes at age ten with her 4H group. Jan has done hand piecing, applique with every sort of technique, hand quilting, machine quilting, embellishment with beads and buttons, wearable art, and scrap quilts. She has made many pieces for the silent auctions including dozens of cardinal wall-hangings. For family and friends, she has made hundreds of quilts from miniatures to king bed quilts.

Being a lover of both color and self-directed challenges, Jan enjoys putting her own spin on patterns, putting her designs together from many different sources, experimenting with color, using fabrics she collected on her travels, and changing up her style, all to expand and deepen her own development as a quilter. This year Jan has enjoyed the creative challenges in her Round Robin group.

When Jan joined IQI in the late '80s she was thrilled and flattered to see her creations hanging in the annual show.

Over the years, Jan has been with the guild through its many levels and changes. Jan has served IQI as President (1994-95), FAOF chair ("too many years!"), publicity chair, and member at large. She has organized the Quilt-In and taught workshops there. Those annual retreats and various small groups are social aspects of quilting that mean a lot to Jan. In fact, she is still sewing with friends from a group that formed in the early 1980s.



I call this one Vevey Pops as the poppy heads were printed on silks and cottons via my inkjet home printer, then sandwiched with batting, quilted, embellished and floated on a background of an upholstery-weight velour. This shows it as work-in-progress but I did complete it and consider it to be one of my more successful attempts at creating art.

I've made more than two dozen of these little Illinois Cardinal quilts through the years. Most have been donated to the guild for the Silent Auction at the Fine Art of Fiber.
